Dear Bishop Ferrando:

I am enclosing copy of the Escritura I made with Mr. Valentine before Parra Capo by which Mr. Valentine transferred to the Domestic & Foreign Missionary Society any and all claims which he had or was supposed to have against you and the Church of Jesus on account of the power of attorney which he held from you.

By this Escritura the Domestic & Foreign Missionary Society becomes Mr. Valentine's successor to the claim. The same Missionary Society by gift from you and the Church of Jesus is to become absolute owner of all the property against which there was any claim. Therefore it seems to me that Parra Toro is correct in his contention that the claim thus entirely disappears. Would you not show this Escritura to your lawyer in New York and ask him if he still feels that you should have a further release from the power of attorney. I am going tomorrow to Ponce and will make the record before Parra Capo of your withdrawal of the power of attorney to Mr. Valentine. If your lawyer still feels that you should have a formal record of release I will draw one here in San Juan as representing the Domestic & Foreign Missionary Society which is Mr. Valentine's successor to the claim, releasing you entirely from the claim.
