Dear Bishop Ferrando:

Mrs. Joseph Robinson has just come in to ask me about shipping the Memorial Cross and candle-sticks for Quebrada Limon, and I am going to tell her to address them directly to you.

I have told her that it was not possible to address them to Quebrada Limon and that you would have to get them out from Ponce. She says that the box in which they will be packed may be too large for an automobile, but I have assured her that even if you have to unbox them there will be no danger of scratching them.

I imagine they will be going down quite soon, though you will be informed more definitely by the next mail.
