My dear Bishop:

I am delighted to have your letter of the 12th, telling me of your satisfactory interview with Dr. Wood. I am delighted very much indeed, and am awaiting your further letter with much interest.

I do not quite understand how you and Dr. Wood have gotten the idea that I will be in New York in October. I have tried to make it clear always that my plan is to make visitations in Santo Domingo and the Virgin Islands in October and go to New York in November. I could, of course, change my plans, with some inconvenience to the clergy if it is necessary or advisable for me to be at the meeting of the Council. In that case, it would be necessary for them to cable me, giving the date of the Council meeting, in order that I may be on time.

Please give my regards to Mrs. Ferrando/ who, I understand, is now at college, and believe me.
