It was resolved that the Ministers salary Be \$400 to be raid by the congregation not to include any out side grant, But he has a right to claim out any sum for any balance due him. \$400 per year gold.

The Annual Election of officers took place. It was moved by Joseph Jackman and seconded by William A. Scandal the officers be re-elected. The Rector thanked the officer and was happy to state that he had raised the balance due on the building \$120.00 It was moved that some steps be taken in regards to the Minister salary as it was understood that he had not received half of the maid \$400 gold. The meeting was closed by singing. "O God, our help in ages past"

A Meeting of the congregation after service was to take place on August 27th evening to decide about the Synod that was is to take place in SA Kits. But is was thought that by the act of W. James Morden, that the meeting was broken up as almost the whole congregation present left to about six.

The bell presented by W. Hydmard to the church on Sept 16th, 1893. Permission having been given by the Governor that it could be rung in the interiols. It was accordingly rung on the 29th of Sept. him the Feast of St. Mich and All the Angels. (An old saddle by Ven. E. Hutson 1893)

William A. Scandal behaved very unbecoming on Friday evening before the death of his wife to persons in the bed room and again on Sunday to me as could not allow him to lay the dead out in the church it been against the law and the congregation would not agree to it at such a time I was Ashamed of him the governor also forbid the dead been brought in the Church.
